

REGISTERING A VEHICLE UNDER THE HISTORIC VEHICLE SCHEME (HVS)

GENERAL INFORMATION

A member may register their vehicle under the Historic Vehicle Scheme through BHCC if it meets the following conditions as set out in Transport for NSW (TfNSW) and Club rules:

- Historic vehicles must be in line with NSW RMS eligibility guidelines refer <u>https://www.rms.nsw.gov.au/roads/registration/get-nsw-registration/historic-vehicles/index.html</u>
- It is a condition of Historic Registration with TfNSW that the registered owner of the vehicle must be a financial member of a recognised club. BHCC is an authorised club recognised by TfNSW.
- Historic vehicles must be as close to original condition as possible. Some acceptable modifications may relate to safety features such as seatbelts and turn indicators, or period accessories and options, if desired.
- Vehicles converted from left-hand drive to right-hand drive may be allowed provided that the vehicle otherwise meets all requirements for the HVS

The Club holds an Annual Inspection Day in mid November each year. Inspections may also be arranged at other times by contacting a Club Inspector.

On first Registration you may nominate the renewal date with the TfNSW. Members are encouraged to use common registration date of 2nd December. This will ensure new registration papers are available to encourage members to come to the November Inspection Day.

NOTE: THE ONLY PEOPLE WHO CAN LEGALLY STAMP/SIGN YOUR DECLARATION FORM IS A RESPONIBLE PERSON REGISTERED WITH THE TfNSW. DUE TO THE NEED FOR THE VEHICLE TO HAVE A CLUB SUITABILITY INSPECTION, OTHER COMMITTEE MEMBERS ARE NOT AUTHORISED TO STAMP/SIGN DECLARATION FORM.

Authorised Inspectors are those issued with an Inspection Book.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED WHEN FIRST REGISTERING YOUR VEHICLE

- Pink Slip or BHCC Inspection Slip

REGISTERING A VEHICLE THROUGH THE CLUB FOR THE FIRST TIME

- 1. Make sure you have all the required documents see the list above.
- 2. Arrange for a Blue, Pink Slip or BHCC Inspection Certificate. If the vehicle has LPG, the vehicle must be inspected by a suitably qualified Inspector.
- 3. Arrange an inspection with a Club inspector to check Historic compliance. Inspector contact details are listed in the Club Magazine. It is preferred that any new vehicles to the club be sighted by 2 x Club Inspectors to ensure the vehicle fits the general level of authenticity appropriate to be registered with the club.
- 4. Present the documents listed above to the Inspectors.
- 5. If the Inspectors are satisfied that the vehicle meets club criteria, they will complete the relevant sections and stamp the Declaration Form.
- 6. Inspectors will record vehicle details which are passed to the Registrar for the Club records. Completed documentation can then be taken to TfNSW for processing.

RENEWING YOUR VEHICLE REGISTRATION UNDER THE HVS

Make sure you have the following documents:

- Registration Renewal Papers
- > Historic Vehicle Declaration Form
- Evidence of Current Club Membership your Membership Card or Receipt for membership payment.
- Arrange for a Pink slip and/or arrange an inspection with a Club Inspector. Depending on date of registration, you may have your Vehicle inspected at the Annual Inspection Day. NOTE: If the vehicle has LPG, the vehicle must be inspected by a suitably qualified Inspector.
- Present the above documents to the Inspector. If the Inspectors are satisfied that the vehicle meets club criteria, they will complete the relevant sections and stamp the Declaration Form.
- Inspectors will record vehicle details which are passed to the Registrar for the Club records.
- Completed documentation can then be taken to TfNSW for processing
